# **How SAP Teams Can Support Students During Summer Months**

SAP Teams across Pennsylvania provided tremendous support to students and families this year. However, the school year is winding down and summer break is on the horizon. A blessing for school staff. However, for students and families who rely on regular supports provided by school, they may not see summer break as a reason to celebrate, but rather as a stressor. SAP Teams can alleviate stress for students and families by ensuring they know where to access support when the bell rings indicating the start of summer. What does this look like? Contacting families directly before the close of the school year to touch base is an excellent starting point. This shows the student/family that they are cared about and opens the door for them to share any concerns they may have about the upcoming break from school.

Develop a comprehensive list of community resources that families may need to access during the summer months. This could include food pantries, clothing closets, bill-pay assistance, medication assistance, mental health crisis lines, etc. Also include county mental health and drug and alcohol offices. This list should be disseminated to all families the SAP Team is supporting, as well as placed on the school entity's website where it can be easily accessed.

Next, review the active SAP cases and identify the in-school and community supports students are currently utilizing. These are the supports that the students will be missing during the summer break. As a team, brainstorm any community supports that could help to fill this need during the summer break. Where appropriate and with the necessary consent, connect families prior to the last day of school to prevent any lapse in service.

# SAP Records - "To Share or Not to Share, That Is the Question."

Puzzled and perplexed about whether your team can share records within your district or with another district's SAP team? Look no further for the answer-it is in <u>Pennsylvania's Student Assistance Program: Frequently Asked</u> Questions and Best Practice Responses document.

# 37. Are SAP teams permitted to share records with other SAP teams within the school entity (e.g., elementary to middle school, middle school to high school)?

The school entity's records policy should be adhered at all times. However, for continuity and ongoing support, teams are encouraged to share records with the next building, especially since transitions are difficult for many students. The goal of sharing records is to maintain consistent support, so the student is successful in the new building. Sharing information is particularly important for continuity of supports if the team is actively working with the student at the end of the school year. There are many variations on how this is addressed within each

school entity. Teaming between building SAP teams would be helpful to determine transition plans and effective communication.

# 38. Are SAP teams permitted to share records with other school entities?

The school entity must make this decision after referring to its records policy. However, SAP files should be included in the list of educational records on the transfer of educational records form. The parent/guardian signs this form, and it is sent to the original school to obtain academic and other educational records. When the new school entity receives the files, the SAP files should only be shared with SAP team members.
