Spring is Here! Time to Enter, Submit, and Officially Release Your 2025-26 Student SAP Data!

SAP Teams: SAP PDE 4092 Data Reporting

Now is the perfect time to organize and begin your year end’s SAP data submission and the official releasing of that data to the state by June 30, 2026. As a reminder, you may access your school’s historical data by going to www.pnsas.org and clicking on the “Data” tab and then clicking on “SAP PDE 4092 Data”. Also, particularly for newly-formed SAP school building teams or new SAP team coordinators, your de-identified student referral data should be recorded on the [PDE 4092 form](#) , accessed on the [Commonwealth SAP On-Line Reporting System](#). As a reminder, all referrals to the SAP team are reported on the PDE-4092, even if the process was not continued (i.e. no parent permission obtained) or is referred to another team.

The system is already open for your team to enter data for this school year, and you can start by first logging into the [Commonwealth SAP On-Line Reporting System](#). Each person entering should have their own password. If you need access, contact your district zone administrator or the help desk at c-jwasser@pa.gov. Next, select “New/Existing PDE 4092 Referral Entry” and choose the school associated with the referral. You then select the existing case number to edit or choose “New SAP Referral” to create a new record. Lastly, click “Apply” and complete the form with as much information as possible. Also note that you can create a new referral using only the referral number and return later to add details. After entering all cases for the year, finally verify that all data is error-free and mark your submission as complete for the year. (See the “release instructions” in the system for the final steps). And for more information regarding data entry, please refer to the [instructions document](#).

It would be advantageous to explore the “SAP PDE 4092 Historical Data and Infographics” section. This provides data trends over past years, an historical overview of SAP referrals, and an easy-to-read infographic summarizing previous reporting years. Taking a few moments now to review these resources can offer valuable insights into statewide patterns and help inform your ongoing support efforts. 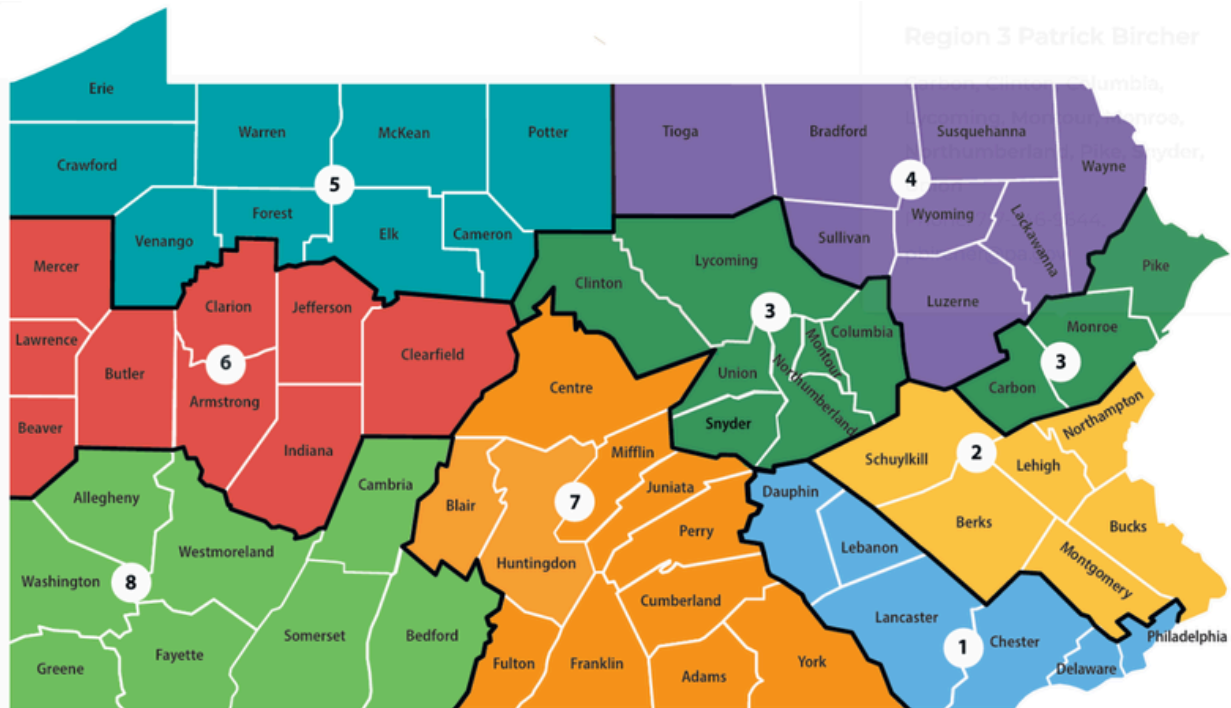
Participants gain actionable strategies, explore research-informed approaches to prevention, and connect with peers across fields such as education, public health, social services, law enforcement, and youth development.
