

The Student Assistance Program (SAP) is an integral part of Pennsylvania schools and helps mobilize school resources to remove barriers to learning. The Pennsylvania Department of Education through the Office of Safe Schools is committed to assisting school entities sustain and build effective SAP teams within each school entity. We are excited to announce that through a recent grant funding opportunity, thirteen SAP training providers across the Commonwealth have received funding awards to offer SAP training at no cost to school entities. (See list below)

As such, school entities will have the opportunity to contact one of the thirteen identified training providers to take advantage of SAP training at no cost to the school entity. Opportunities to access the free SAP training is based on the SAP training providers' grant award. SAP training is offered in person and virtual based on the specific training provider. School entities should contact one of the thirteen identified SAP training providers as soon as possible to take advantage of this opportunity.

In addition to SAP training at no cost, each school entity will have the ability to cover costs associated with substitutes if they are needed for coverage during training. Information regarding substitute costs must be shared directly with the training provider to receive reimbursement.

This training opportunity is available now through December 2026 or as grant funds remain available for each training provider. You must contact the training provider directly to determine the availability. As you know, SAP is mandated in Pennsylvania public schools as per Chapter 12, 12.42 of the PA School Code and Act 211 of 1990 (24 P.S., 12, 12.42-1547). We encourage SAP coordinators, school administrators, and school contacts to reach out directly to a training provider below to take advantage of this opportunity.
